7	Questions and Answers	15min	Questions in chat: Eric Ripley: A UNDP CM study was mentioned in the timeline slide. What is the focus of this study (i.e., is it a general study on CM or in some way specific to ODS/F-Gases)? If a broad focus, how is it expected to inform the FM workgroup and this study? > answer	All participants
			Eric Ripley: Could Felicia please expand on the notion of "removal" and ODS/HFC management. ODS projects are thought of commonly as an avoided emission rather than removal. I understand generally how these could also be thought of as "removal" but the definition of that term is important and could be a game changer for how these projects are perceived in carbon markets moving forward.	
			> answer Adrian Bukmanis: Something I'd like some clarity on re VCM. My understanding is credits for destruction are considered no longer additional where there is a product stewardship or other incentive scheme in place (as per Verra methodology). EPR or stronger policy that has been mentioned earlier. Can someone clarify as would have a significant cross-impact – one for the report?	
			> answer Eric Ripley: If it is added to report, we should also be clear that these EPR programs are not very successful to encourage recovery just by way of existence. There is still a lot of gas that is not recovered/vented even in jurisdictions with EPR. The existence of these schemes does disallow carbon credit currently but there may be a way for the two to coexist in future. > Taken note of as feedback for the study	
			Rachel Pekker: Objection that too little attention is paid to Article 6 as a funding option in the study. It should be highlighted / thematised more. > Noted as feedback for further work on the study. Current assessment: Article 6 may be more suitable as a future funding mechanism in	
			a few years' time than as a current one.
